



The cooperation of startup enterprises with the private sector alone would not mark Bangkok as the new destination for growing opportunities for businesses. So, what makes Bangkok such a crucial hub for startups? Solid initiatives from the thai government are key to providing a nurturing environment allowing startups to unlock their success.



began in 2012 with a mere \$3 million investment.¹ Within five years, funding exploded to more than \$828 million.² To this point, this rapidly escalating flow of startup capital might cause potential investors to ask, "Has Bangkok grown too fast? Is the proper infrastructure in place?" And by the time they received an answer they would see that Bangkok made the headlines yet again, being rated last year as the best city in Asia to launch a startup business (No. 7 in the world).³

The Bangkok startup ecosystem buildup

Not surprisingly, 2017 was a golden year for Thailand as a startup hub. Its readiness to embrace the innovations and entrepreneurial ingredients necessary to provide a world-class environment for startup businesses, including the development of innovation districts, the project to spur nationwide spaces for tech startups by National Innovation Agency (NIA), has made it the place to be in 2018 and beyond. As such, Thailand will not only be known as the world's top travel destination, but its capital city will deservedly be known as the Asia-gateway for startups.

STRONG SUPPORT FROM GOVERNMENT ORGANISATIONS

NATIONAL STARTUP COMMITTEE (NSC)

Appointed by Thailand's Ministry of Finance, the NSC directs and organises all government agencies and functions relating to startup entrepreneurship and its capital sources, as well as entrepreneurial integration.

MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Bridges science, technology, and innovation through collaboration.

NATIONAL SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (NSTDA)

Supports R&D in several target areas; agriculture and food, energy and environment, health and medicines, bio-resources and communities, and manufacturing and service industries.

THAILAND BOARD OF INVESTMENT (BOI)

Promotes investment that helps enhance national competitiveness by encouraging R&D, innovation, value creation in the agricultural, industrial and services sectors as well as SMEs.

STARTUP NATION: THAILAND 4.0 BUILDING BLOCK

Gearing the country's economy towards deep technology business with the promising economic flagship model "Thailand 4.0," the Thai government is fully committed to accelerating economic growth in a way that would be stable, prosperous, and sustainable, as well as transforming Thailand into an innovation-based economy in response to a rapidly changing global economic context.

This transforming economy has historically been dependent on exporting heavily from the following sectors: agriculture (Thailand 1.0), light industry (Thailand 2.0), and advanced industry (Thailand 3.0). Resulting from these models, Thailand has long encountered a middle income trap (MIT) combined with inequality and imbalance challenges. To

unlock the country from those disputes, the Thai Government in 2016 launched the new economic model, Thailand 4.0, which seeks advanced economic development through innovation.

Thailand 4.0 has prioritised the development in various clusters for innovation and startup entrepreneurship ranging from Food and Agriculture, Biotechnology, Health and Wellness, Biomedicine, Smart Devices, Robotics and Mechatronics, Internet of Things (IoT), Embedded Technology and Digital Industry, and Culture and Creative Industries, as well as High-Value Services.

According to Bangkok Post, Somkid Jatusripitak, Thailand's Deputy Prime Minister confirmed in a speech at the recent Startup Thailand 2018 that Thailand is heading toward on becoming a Startup Nation inspired by the economy of Isarael. "Accelerating and creating more startups is a core government

policy to energise entrepreneurs for the future innovation-based economy and to drive Thailand's economic growth in the long run."

Positioning Thailand as a startup hub in Asia by 2020, the government has funded 10 billion baht for the Competitiveness Fund and 6 billion baht for startup venture funds on Thai technology-based and service -based startups. They have also been accelerating three startup-related laws, including the Startup Act, Regulatory Sandbox Act and Bayh-Dole Act.

The Startup Act will facilitate the founding of local and international startups through tax incentives and foreign shareholders. The Regulatory Sandbox Act will allow startups to pilot new innovative ideas. The Bayh-Dole Act will allow researchers the right to their intellectual property research.

SYSTEM INTEGRATOR

In 2009 National Innovation Agency (NIA) was established, it has been assigned by the Ministry of Science and Technology in order to spearhead the startup business development and promotion project as part of the goal to make Thailand a hub of startup business development and innovation.

NIA is the system integrator who commits the development mission of startup ecosystem in Thailand, as well as, connects its ecosystem to the world.

SMART VISA

If you are thinking about relocating for your next business project, you should strongly consider Bangkok as your destination. Inspired by the French Tech Visa program, Thailand has launched the Smart Visa, a four-year visa for highly qualified and skilled professionals, startup entrepreneurs and investors to boost this booming ecosystem by attracting a pool of skilful human resources. Those obtaining the Smart Visa are allowed to begin work in the Kingdom immediately, without having to obtain a separate work permit from the Labour Ministry. The Thai government also extends the benefits of this visa to the visa holder's spouse and children.

INNOVATION DISTRICT

Several areas in Bangkok have been designated as "Innovation District" by the Ministry of Science and Technology in order to fully turn Bangkok into an innovative startup hub of Asia. These districts include Yothi, Pathumwan, Klong San, Rattanokosin, Kluay Nam Thai, Lat Krabang, Punnawithi and Bang Sue.

The next Innovation District phase has been planned to enhance the Thailand's Eastern Economic Corridor. The selected areas include nearby eastern seaboard cities such as Bang Saen, Si Racha, Pattaya, U-tapao and Ban Chang.

Further support for promoting and enriching the growth of Asia's startup business network is noted by the Thai government-empowered DISTRICT SUMMIT 2018. This two-day event led by the NIA was a huge success with large numbers of participants from various industries. Speaker after prominent speaker highlighted Bangkok as a city of innovation, ready to help startup companies realise their potential and vision.



GLOBAL HUB PLATFORM

Yothi is the Thailand's first-ever innovation district model that focuses on three development aspects, including Medical Technology (MEDTECH), Government Technology (GOVTECH), and City Technology (CITYTECH). True Digital Park, the next global startup destination sponsored by True Corporation, is located in Punnawithi and gaining supports from public and private sectors in order to create the tech startup scene. Kluay Nam Thai Innovation Industries District (KIID) serving as the bridge connecting the old and new industries. Its existing industrial capacities and the cooperation from Bangkok University will facilitate startups and investors as well as improve the quality of locals' living and hood itself.

"Chiang Mai is among the world's top destinations for digital nomads and expats from around the world, with the roughly estimated number of ten thousands." Pan-Arj Chairat, Director of the National Innovation Agency revealed NIA has followed Paris & Co model, a success startup ecosystem model from France, in order to allow Chiang Mai's municipality operating its community to facilitate overseas startups. By the end of 2018, NIA will launch Chiang Mai & Co at Tha Pae Road, this promising project cooperated with Thailand's Ministry of Industry will provide more working spaces for foreign startups and digital nomads, as well as other facilitation on immigration affair such as smart visa. This model will also support educational institutes and startups in the city to exchange knowledge and cooperation between them.

Anticipating Thailand to become a global startup destination, NIA has considered Chiang Mai & Co project to be one of the completions to strengthen the growth ecosystem for startups similar to the other 15 innovation districts.

MASSIVE TALENT POOL

In order to meet the demands of the workforce for the industrial sector following this lucrative initiative by Prime Minister Prayut, Thailand has been building a great pool of talent, full of international and domestic qualified workers for this startup ecosystem.

King Mongkut University of Technology Thonburi, the country's prominent technology academic institution, launched the KMUTT Knowledge Exchange for Innovation Center (KX), which helps facilitate the exchange of knowledge of technology and innovation focusing on manufacturing enterprises for its students and academic allies.

The Chulalongkorn University Engineering Alumni Association has set up the Intania Open Innovation Club (IOIC), the angel fund providing financial support to Chulalongkorn University's engineering students and graduates who are keen to commercialise their innovative academic projects. After two years

of the establishment, the IOIC has invested in startups' projects for nearly \$8 million so far.

Thammasat University, an 83-year-old institution of high learning, has positioned itself as the "entrepreneurial university" after launching the "TuiPi", Thammasat University's Centre of Intellectual Property and Business Incubator.

Thailand's vast university system, with joint support from government agencies, is offering many newly launched deep tech development degrees across the country. The private sector has joined in also, offering entrepreneurial courses to further professional development. Both the public and private sectors have firmly backed Thailand's ever-growing reservoir of talent in technology, business, and entrepreneurship.

From the recent success in 2017, the Startup Thailand League by the NIA is returning this year. The startup business model-pitching competition will be available to all university students in order to enhance Bangkok's startup workforce by inspiring young people to have an entrepreneurial and innovative mindset. This event is part of the "Innovate Startup" — the programme through the cooperation of the NIA, SPA, STI and NSTDA — containing several encouraging activities such as funding for research, supporting creation of prototype working space, and bridging business relationships with prominent corporations for students from 35 educational institutions and 1,000 vocational schools across the country.

STI INFRASTRUCTURE

Aiming as Thailand's regional and global connect, Regional Science Park (RSP) programme has been set up since 2012 by Science Park Promotion Agency (SPA), the organisation supervised by Thailand's Ministry of Science and Technology. The programme has aimed to encourage the innovation from new technology businesses and to construct the growth ecosystem countrywide in order to endorse innovative development from the collaboration from academy, government and private sector.

The network of RSP contains three regional science parks including Northern Science Park (NSP), Northeast Science Park (NESP), and Southern Science Park (SSP).

DYNAMIC INVESTMENT LANDSCAPE

The funds raised in the vicinity of \$305 million during the year 2012-2017 from venture capital firms and investors¹ has positively reflected the significant growth of a startup ecosystem. In the past years, large numbers of corporations and leading Thai commercial banks have helped unlock entrepreneurship with funding support and scaled up innovative companies as key players in this business environment.

The American seed stage investment firm, 500 TukTuks, which focused on Thai microfunding, crowned last year's portfolio with 17 more deals. With 48 deals since 2015, 500 TukTuks ranks as the most active venture capital firm in the Bangkok startup scene.

The surge of corporate venture capital or CVC across a variety of industries last year indicates that more corporations now

envisage the growth of startup businesses. "B2B businesses have shaped Thailand's business landscape, so either CVC or startup growth seen here is a good sign for the ecosystem, it is profitable for both ends," said Thanapong Na Ranong, president of the Thai Venture Capital Association (TVCA). At the early stage we saw CVCs limited to financial institutions (Beacon Venture Capital, Digital Ventures, Bangkok Bank InnoHub and Krungsri Finnovate) and telcos (InVent, dtac Accelerate and True Incube), In 2017, more corporations stepped in from the real estate development sector, corporations including Ananda Development PLC (Ananda Urban-Tech), Sansiri PLC (Siri Ventures) and SC Asset Corporation PLC (SC Able), all helped with startup companies related to technology for property solutions.

The rise of corporate venture capital has constantly shown that corporate players from other industries, ranging from PTT's ExpresSo (energy), AddVenrures by SCG (construction), Dusit Thani (hospitality), and the newly launched in 2018 Singha Corp's Singha

Ventures (beverages), have been eager to stimulate the domestic and international startup investment.

Following the government's vision on encouraging new investment for businesses and startups, the country launched a new tax exemption for up to 10 years* for venture capital firms and private equity trusts who invest in technology and innovation businesses in Thailand's 10 core industries.



GROWING OPPORTUNITY

Steering the country toward Thailand 4.0, the Thai Government is devoted to transforming Thailand into an innovation driven economy which the key driver of economic landscape are Thai startup companies.

In Startup Thailand 2016, the first ever annual startup national event in Thailand, Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-ocha confirmed that the government supports a growing ecosystem for startups or "NEW — New Economic Warrior", which includes startup integrations, amendments of regulations relating to tax exemptions, and stimulation for more investment in the startup scene.

Thai government has attempted to build a favourable startup ecosystem in order to succeed with their New Economic Warrior vision. To encourage startup warriors to step into the Bangkok startup ecosystem, Thailand has reshaped business regulations involved in employee stock ownership plan (ESOP), vesting convertible debts, and

preferred shares, not to mention a five year corporate income tax exemption offering to startup businesses relating to S-curve industrial sectors and the establishment of technology rating and credit guarantee systems.

Last year was a promising year signalling more opportunities for growth for the Thailand startup hub. The hottest startups in 2017 in Bangkok came from these three sectors: e-commerce, fintech and logistics.

In 2016, the number of startups in Thailand was about 700 and roughly doubled in a year, revealed former Minister of Science and Technology Atchaka Sibunruang at Startup Thailand 2017, the startup networking event held in Bangkok last year. This healthy ecosystem has been active with 1,500 of the 8,000 proposed startups that created 7,500 jobs. The total fund size of up to \$828 million was raised last year, and the \$65 million fund of Series B round of a Commerce was the highest in 2017, while the raised fund of \$25 million ICO was in the digital pocket of Omise, a Thai-based online payment solutions startup.1 This particular Initial Coin Offering fund has created a lot of hype in the new age of startup fundraising in Bangkok.

Growing rapidly in the past years as related startups have to rely on its integration for their products and services, Deep tech is among the next waves of startup industries in Southeast Asia. With the combination of the excellent ICT infrastructure and large well-educated population, Thailand has strong market potential to fully deliver great amount of advancements as well as technical talents to support this area of business in the nearly future. At the recent Startup Thailand 2018, Science and Technology Minister Suvit Maesincee affirmed that Thai government can help generate demand via smart city solutions which will drive Thai startup communities to grow faster and allow them to participate in the development focusing on hardware and deep technology.

Bangkok earned a 10 score for this category because the city's healthy startup ecosystem offers an auspicious and exciting professional path that motivates you can remain confident that each new millennials to relocate here.



Why Ho Chi Minh City?

"I love Vietnam. When you live outside your country, as I did, you realize how special your mother tongue is when you hear it, even from a distance. That was a very important experience for me, because it made me believe that it was my duty to do something big for my country. Ten years ago, we positioned VNG as the first unicorn startup of ASEAN, but now, no other companies can be as big as VNG is. Somehow, we lagged behind other countries.

"I chose HCMC to start the company. I feel I belong here. People are energetic, the population is big. In Vietnam, if you ask, everyone will agree that HCMC is the best place to start a company," said Trung Nguyen, CEO of Lozi.

Startup Ecosystem

"During the early days of the company, we hardly saw any support from the government or any meaningful events that support startups. Things are changing. Now, everyone is offering their hands to help startup companies, we thus have a slight advantage to recruit developers and employees at a low cost. This is the true support that startup needs. At some point, taxes or policies are too big for a small company to enjoy the fruit from that. If we can do something, it must be offering awareness to the people and society about what a startup is, so people can accept that by working at a startup, you must accept a low salary to receive a lot in return in the future."

Business Challenges

It's still hard to raise capital from VC if you say that you are from Vietnam, and are operating only in Vietnam. A lot of venture capital is poured into Singapore, Indonesia, and Malaysia, not Vietnam, the Philippines or Thailand. I believe that this will change in the near future. And if we want to see that change, we have to prove that Vietnam or Thailand or the Philippines can also create unicorn companies like Goiek of Indonesia or Grab of Malaysia.

First, I think the agriculture industry is going through a massive structural upgrade. The major drives are, one, the rapid consolidation of small farmland, and, two, ever increasing labor costs. Second, I believe the internet is reaching lower-end markets, which drives the transformation of traditional industries and presents immense opportunities. I believe these two factors present rare opportunities for a platform type of business to emerge.
